Relational Technical Assistance

Project Roadmap uses a relational approach to technical assistance (TA). This method focuses on building strong relationships with task forces and individuals, providing them with the support and space needed to learn, grow, and enhance their collaborative efforts.

Peer Learning

A cornerstone of this approach is peer learning. Whether through meetings with a Task Force Liaison (TFL), connecting with colleagues, participating in field coaching or in-person events, Project Roadmap offers a variety of structured opportunities and connections for peer-to-peer learning.

PROJECT ROADMAP PEER-TO-PEER MENU



CONNECT WITH COLLEAGUES: Ask Project Roadmap to help you identify and connect with ECM peers to share ideas, experiences, and insights.



TASK FORCE LIAISONS: Consult with Project Roadmap's team of peer mentors.



FIELD COACHING: Connect with the group of peers in your discipline. Suggest topics!



CONVENINGS (in-person): Attend an in-person ECM convening. Meet your colleagues face-to-face.



YOUR IDEAS: Reach out to share ideas and/or brainstorm opportunities.

Attend Convenings (In-Person)

SUPPORT AVAILABLE

The goal of Project Roadmap's training and technical assistance is to support the development and implementation of the core elements of the ECM model. Peer-to-peer learning enables task forces to exchange examples of successful victim-centered approaches that increase the identification of victims of human trafficking of all forms and ages and the pursuit of justice on their behalf.

Project Roadmap supports collaborative learning, where each participant has something to gain from the interaction. To that end, we identify task forces that are curious, invested in learning and evolving.

Because of our relational TA approach, we are continuously observing and gathering information on task force needs across the entire ECM program. We confer with the requester, TFLs, and OVC, and base decisions on observations and those conversations to make peer connections.
